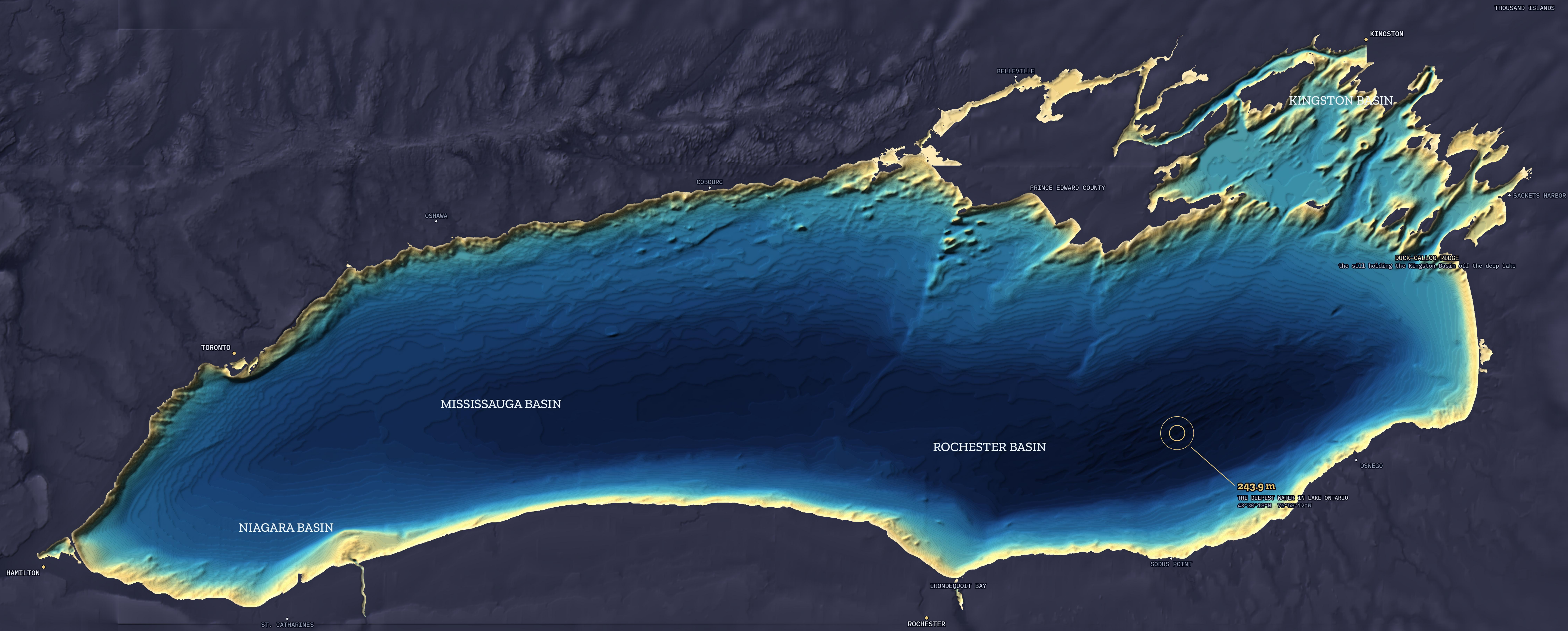


NOAA NCEI BATHYMETRY • 3 ARC-SECOND GRID • 1 METRE PLATES TO 25 M

The Floor of Lake Ontario

The smallest Great Lake by surface area and much the deepest for its size: it holds more than three times Erie's water in three quarters of Erie's space. Through the middle the floor is almost featureless, the signature of deep water and fine mud.
